Spill kits should be readily available and stored near the chemical use. It is important that all lab personnel know the location, content, and how to use the spill kit. Spill kits should be inspected at least yearly, to determine viability of supplies.

The United States has adopted the Global Harmoniz ed System (GHS) of Classifying and Labeling Chemicals. The biggest visible impact of the GHS is the appearance of and information required for labels and SDSs.

Labels require signal words, pictograms, precautionary statements and appropriate hazard statements. The goal is that the same set of rules for classifying hazards, and the same format and contents for labels and safety data sheets will be used around the world.
